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Introduction


- New Aged Care Act starting 1 November 2025
- Aged Care shift towards rights-based framework
- Retirement Village reforms increased transparency, consumer protection and governance
- Retirement village legislation is evolving alongside aged care reforms
- With change comes opportunity

 particularly with the introduction of the Support at Home program

Retirement Village vs Aged Care – Regulatory Landscape

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Support at Home – a blurring of the boundaries between the regulatory regimes





New Provider Categories

Operators can register to deliver eligible services and access Commonwealth funding.



Eligible Services

Are largely non-clinical (incl. domestic assistance, transport, social support, minor home modifications, and the provision of assistive technology).



Register as a Provider

Access Commonwealth funding, deliver services onsite and support ageing in place.



Considerations

- Navigate dual regulation: state (retirement villages) + federal (aged care)
- Operational and financial planning required

Direct Delivery by Operators

Flexible Service Delivery under Support at Home

Partnering with Existing Providers

Operators can register to deliver eligible services and access Commonwealth funding.

- Third-party agreements
- Access to subsidised services
- Lower compliance and risk burden
