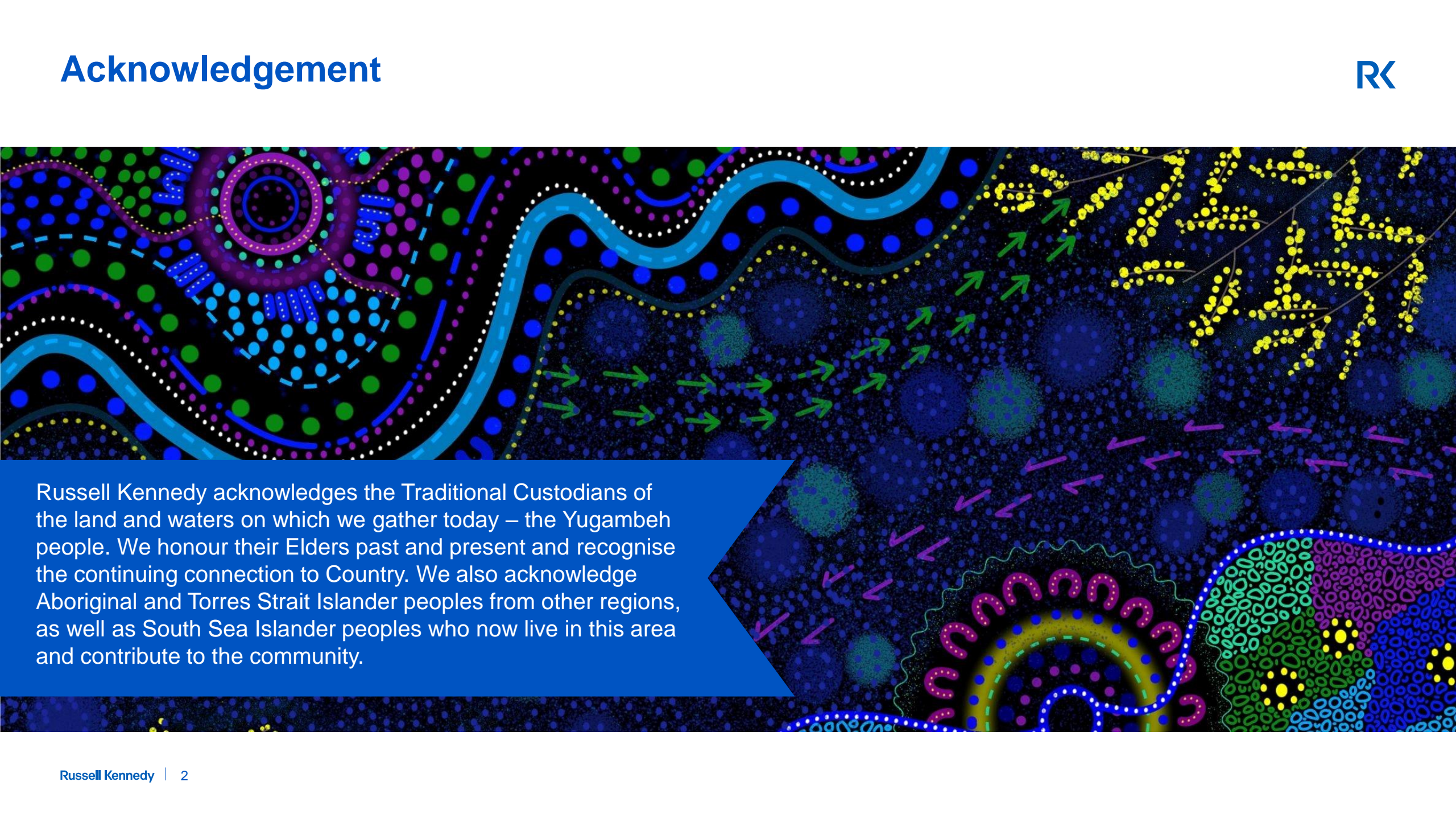

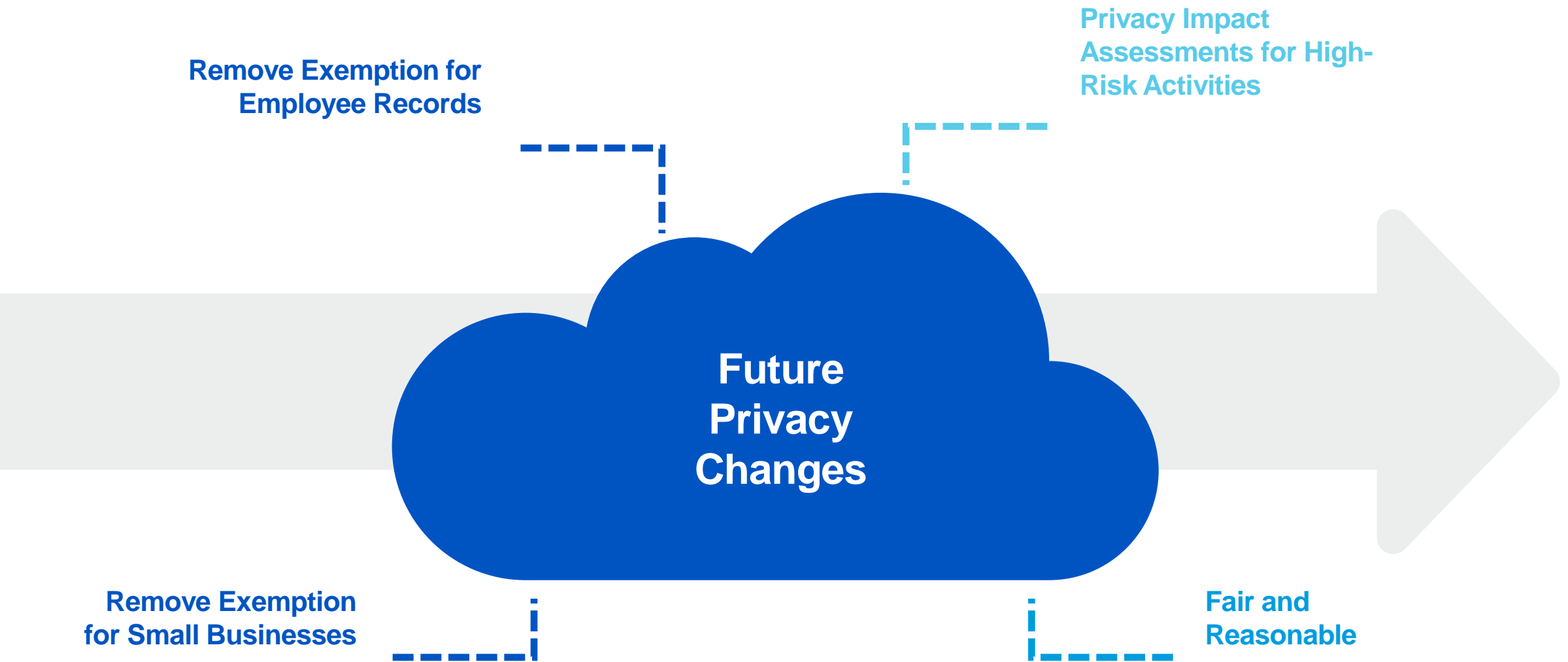

# Privacy – Future Changes



## What ASD saw

Answered over **36,700** calls to the Australian Cyber Security Hotline, up **12%**

- on average, **100 calls per day**, an increase from **90 calls per day**

Average self-reported cost of cybercrime per report for businesses, **down 8%** overall

- small business: **\$49,600** (up 8%)
- medium business: **\$62,800** (down 35%)
- large business: **\$63,600** (down 11%)

Received over **87,400** cybercrime reports, **down 7%**

- on average a report every 6 minutes, consistent with last year

## Top 3 self-reported cybercrime types for business

- email compromise (20%)
- online banking fraud (13%)
- business email compromise fraud resulting in financial loss (13%)

Almost **\$84 million** in losses due to business email compromise were self-reported to ReportCyber. Business email compromise continues to significantly impact businesses, with an average financial loss of over **\$55,000** for each confirmed incident

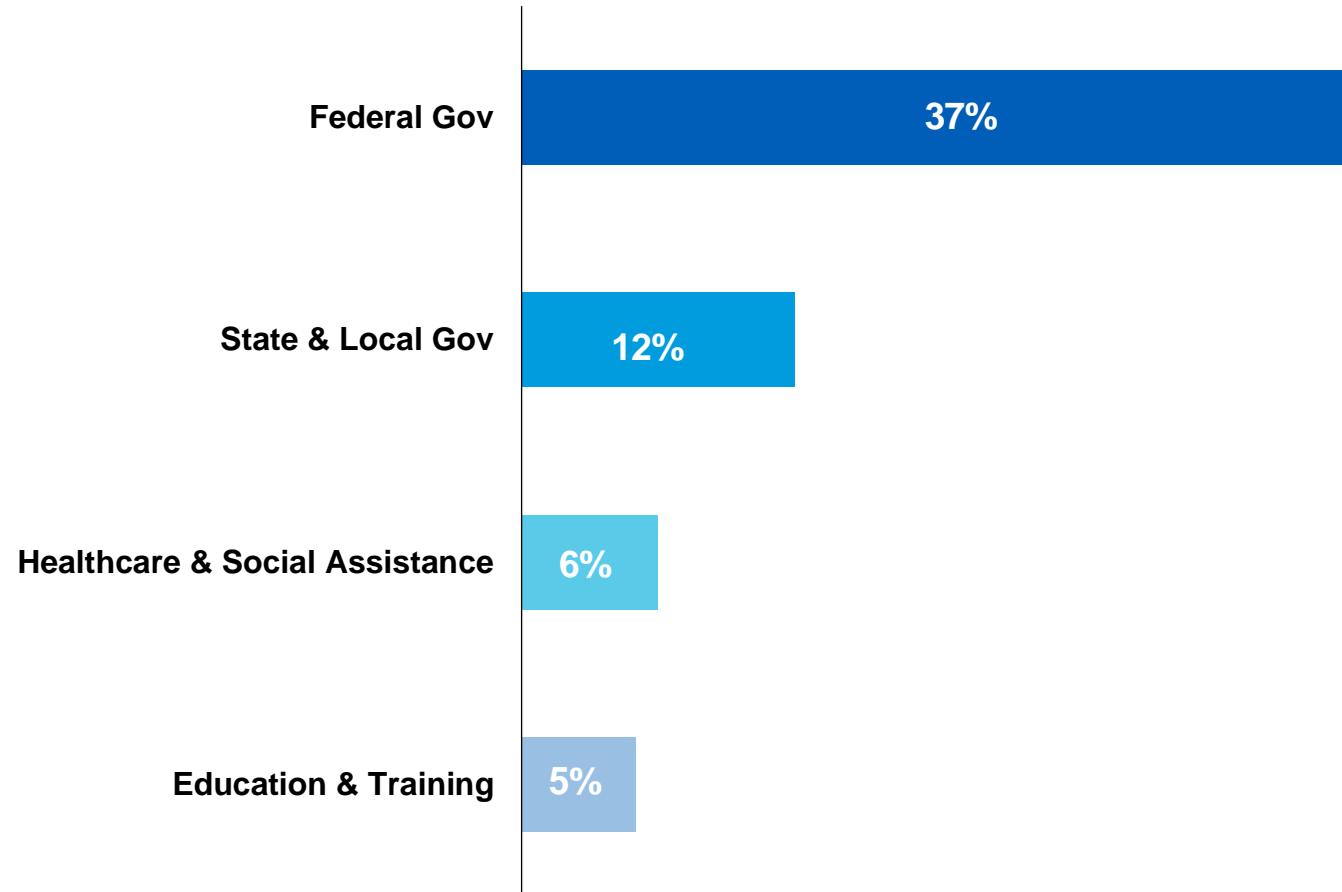
**11%** of all incidents responded to included **ransomware**, a **3% increase** from last year



# Cyber Incident Reporting



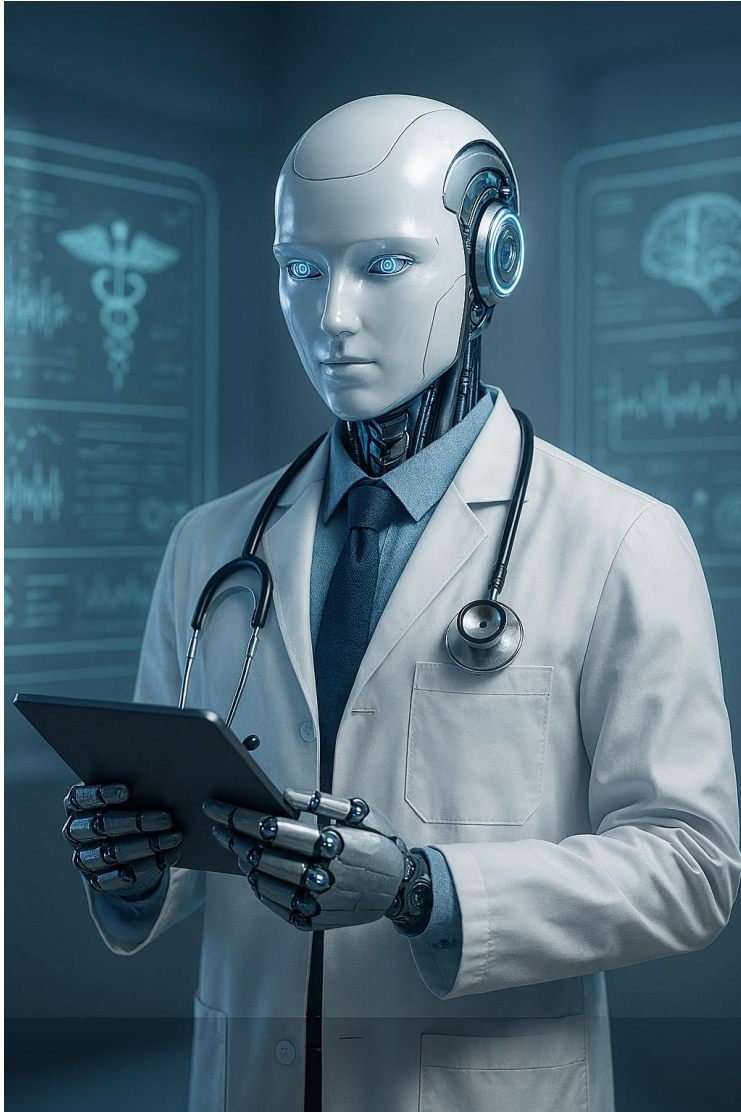
Top 4 Reporting Sectors

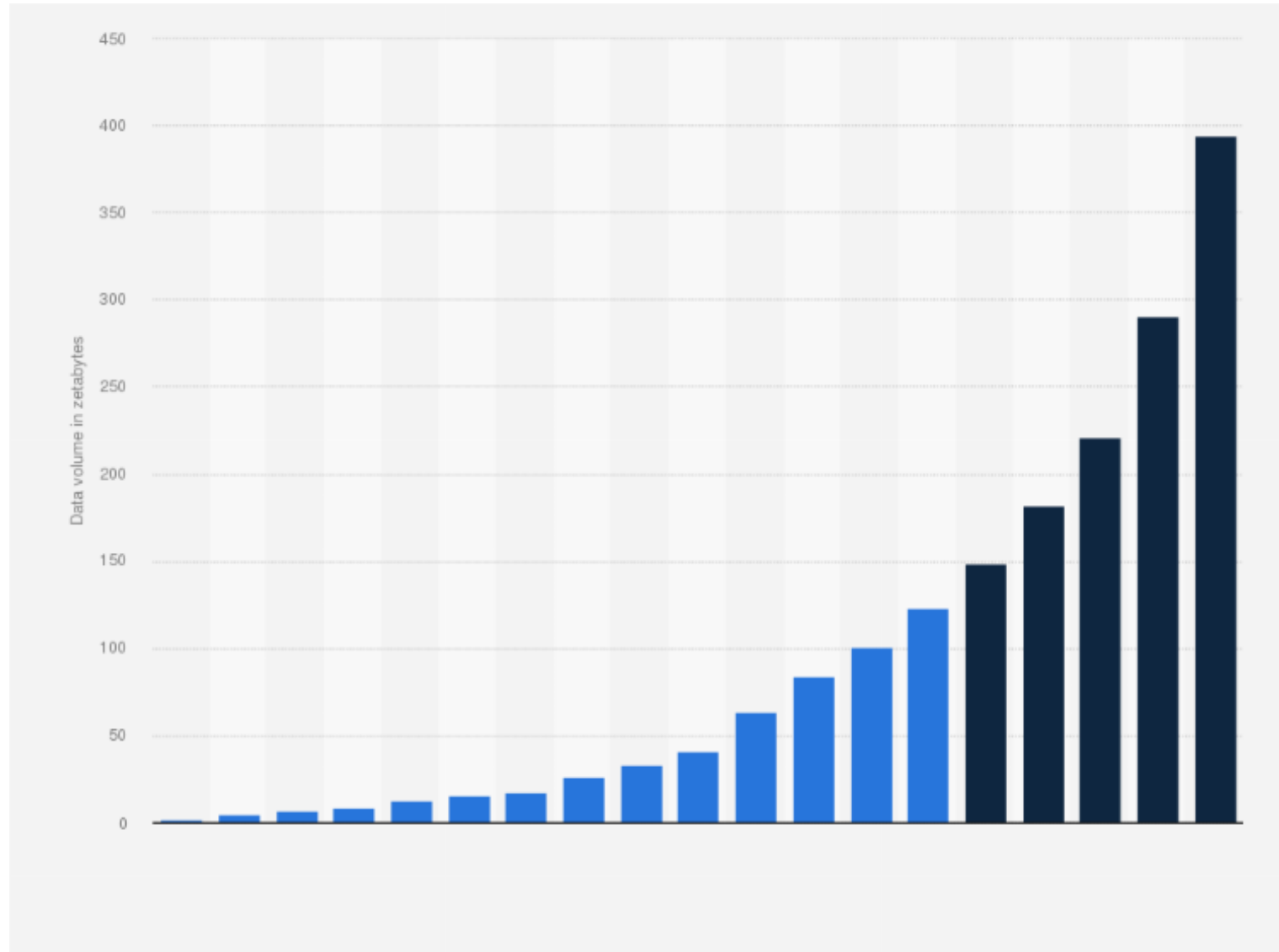
