



Clients also receive personal care, social support, and domestic assistance, helping them maintain independence and quality of life in their own.




Program overview





You are all truly amazing 💖





Challenges

- Establishing credibility as a new service
- Vast geographical footprint
- Workforce management
- Managing service delivery expectations
- Isolated workforce
- Fatigue management





Successes

- Significant expansion of the service since commencement.
- Strong collaborative relationships built with local HHS and specialist care services.
- Regular participation at all multi-disciplinary team meetings across the state, to present updates and support the referral pipeline.
- Development of robust relationships between our Nurse Practitioners, Clinical Nurse Consultants, and medical teams
- A joint approach to engaging ruralist GP's.-The Emerald story





Successes cont.

- Strong community team collaboration across BlueCare Neighbourhoods, providing in-home respite, personal care, and nursing support where possible.
- Several opportunities to present at local conferences, showcase days, training opportunities and PHN events.
- Paediatrics enabling families to care for children at home for end of life care for the first time in areas with dedicated in-home palliative care support.
- Successful completion of accreditation last year with no requirements or recommendations
- A strong committed collaborative, dedicated statewide team of palliative care nurses.
