




Introduction of New Aged Care Act

Statutory duty of care for registered provider and certain responsible persons


Reasonably practicable is a consideration of:













Must ensure that the conduct of the provider does not cause adverse effects to the health and safety of individuals to whom the provider is **delivering** funded aged care services while the provider is delivering those services so far as reasonably practicable.

Statutory Duty of Care – Duty of Certain Responsible Persons





Certain responsible persons

Must exercise due diligence to ensure that the provider complies with the provider's statutory duty.

Duty will only apply to operators who: Executive decision makers or any other person who has authority, responsibility or significant influence over planning, directing or controlling the activities of the provider.




