

- Challenges of Micro-Regulation reducing quality care to rigid rules and inputs not outcomes. Limits innovation.
- Sustainable funding for Concessional Residents to ensure fair and adequate care services.
- Growth in Home Care Packages must expand rapidly to meet increasing demand among aging populations.
- Better Integration aged care and health care is critical as seen in Covid and now with the bed block crisis in our hospitals
- Rights enforcement in future iterations of the Act to meet individual needs in a timely manner

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
